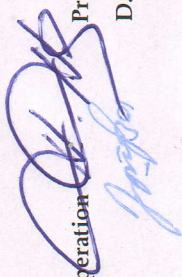

	Course description The presented textbook, "Uzbek Language for Foreigners" (Level B1), is designed to strengthen the language competencies of learners who already possess a sufficient knowledge of Uzbek. This textbook serves as the next methodological step after completing programs for levels A1 and A2, aiming to provide knowledge that aligns with the requirements of the B1 level through the four fundamental skills: speaking, writing, reading and listening. The book contains 12 topics, presenting key grammatical structures of the Uzbek language and its national-cultural features in a harmonized manner. Each topic is logically structured to ensure the cognitive development of learners and is reinforced

with methodologically effective exercises. To enhance the practical value of the textbook, it is supplemented with audio and video materials, enriching its educational significance.

The textbook also focuses on developing intercultural communicative competence by introducing learners to lexical units and commonly used expressions specific to Uzbek culture. It stands out from other Uzbek language textbooks by aligning the topics of reading materials with communicative contexts and fostering skills for drafting essential documents in Uzbek.

At the end of each topic, various exercises, video materials provided via QR codes, and listening tasks aim to develop critical thinking skills, adapt learners to communicative scenarios, and expand their vocabulary. With this textbook, you will acquire pragmatic competencies such as selecting appropriate language tools for familiar situations, expressing coherent thoughts on social, cultural, and educational topics, and comprehending authentic and semi-authentic discourse.
